Central Valley Tobacco Control Policy (CVTCP) Internship Program

A program aimed at reducing tobacco-related health disparities among the Hispanic/Latino(a) population

INTERNSHIP OVERVIEW

The CVTCP Internship Program was established by the Unidos Por Salud Project, a program of the California Health Collaborative, with the goal of engaging undergraduate students who have a passion for serving and reducing health disparities negatively impacting Hispanic/Latinos in the Central Valley in public health and tobacco control efforts.

Students will be directly involved in creating policy change and implementing public health intervention activities. Interns will receive professional development and will be paired with a tobacco control program led by either a local county health department or a non-profit organization.

- Current undergraduate college student
- Able to complete at least 60 hours of internship by December 9th, 2020
- Attend the scheduled orientation
- Attend monthly check in meetings
- Complete a project or activity to support community understanding of Hispanic/Latino health disparities

*Returning interns can reapply based on recommendation from their site supervisor***

- Send a resume and Letter Of Interest (LOI) to Ericka Corchado (contact below)
- LOI must be no more than 2 pages and incorporate the following:
- 1. Why you are interested in the CVTCP internship and serving the Hispanic/Latino community?
- 2. Your qualifications (language speaking abilities. experience, skills, etc.)
- 3. What are some tobacco-related health disparities affecting the Hispanic/Latino community?
