Under general direction from the Project Director, the Community Engagement Coordinator (CEC) supports the planning, implementation and evaluation activities of the REACT Program. REACT is a Central Valley regional tobacco control program tasked with reducing tobacco related health disparities and improving health equity among rural and Hispanic/Latino residents of Tulare, Kings and Fresno County.

ESSENTIAL DUTIES

- 1. Consults with the Project Director and the Project Coordinator, relative to planning, policy and program direction.
- 2. Responsible for providing intervention activities to reduce/prevent use of tobacco and reduce tobacco related health disparities among Hispanic/Latinos living in rural communities through policy change, social norm change, and community organizing.
- 3. With support from the Program Coordinator, performs ongoing process and outcome evaluations.
- 4. Assists with plans and logistics for all program meetings and educational presentations.
- 5. Provides support in the development of proposals, applications, and/or requests for new or continued funding.
- 6. Represents the California Health Collaborative at meetings with committees, community agencies, care providers and related entities, and facilitates inter-agency linkages, communication and collaboration.
- 7. Engages and trains young adults in the Central Valley as tobacco control advocates.
- 8. Engage adults in the tri-county region as leaders in tobacco control efforts.
- 9. Procures required levels of community support to assure contract compliance.
