Under general direction of the Project Director and the Program Manager, the Training and Engagement Facilitator (TEF) supports the planning, implementation and evaluation activities of a collaborative project in Kings County to increase awareness and understanding of the effects of Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs) and support staff of Medi-Cal providers respond with trauma informed care.

ESSENTIAL DUTIES

- 1. Consults with the Project Director and the Program Manager, relative to planning, development and program direction.
- 2. Under direction of the Program Manager, assists with the development of training materials, including presentations, agendas, outreach materials, and training activities to create awareness of ACEs, the importance of ACEs screening, the impact of toxic stress, and providing trauma informed care in Kings County.
- 3. Under direction from the Program Manager, the TEF will support the development and implementation of provider engagement sessions in which staff of Medi-Cal providers can share best practices and engage in peer-to-peer learning on developing trauma informed systems of care.
- 4. With support from the Program Manager, the TEF performs ongoing process and outcome evaluations for the project.
- 5. Assists with planning and logistics for all program meetings and educational presentations.
- 6. Represents the California Health Collaborative at meetings with committees, community agencies, care providers and related entities, and facilitates inter-agency linkages, communication and collaboration.
- 7. Procures required levels of community support to assure contract compliance.
