

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## WHAT'S IN A CIGARETTE?

Approximately **600** ingredients compose a cigarette (1). These ingredients when burned create more than **7,000** chemicals and compounds. More than **70** of these chemicals are known to cause cancer and are toxic (2).

## Nicotine & the Brain

Nicotine\* produces a pleasurable feeling by activating the reward circuits that are part of the Limbic system\*.

This activation also causes the overproduction of the neurotransmitter dopamine\* in the circuits.

Nicotine is so addictive in part because of this over production of the feel-good neurotransmitter, dopamine, and the decrease in its breakdown.

the enzyme\* responsible for breaking down dopamine is decreased due to nicotine use. This results in higher levels of dopamine.

The increase of dopamine pushed the tobacco product user to continue use as this results in pleasurable feelings.

- \*Nicotine main toxic chemical in tobacco products that is highly addictive.
- \*Limbic System The complex system of nerves in the brain which control emotions such as pleasure and drives such as hunger, sex, needs.
- \*Dopamine a chemical released by nerve cells this neurotransmitter plays a key role in reward-motivated behavior; associated with feel good feelings, euphoria, bliss, motivation, and many more.
  \*Enzyme molecules that assist with chemical reactions such as breaking down dopamine to be more easily absorbed when this process is slowed, dopamine stays at a higher-than-normal level for a greater period.

## **Tackling Tobacco Law Enforcement in Merced County**



The Health Policy and Wellness Division of Merced County Department of Public Health has begun work on a new tobacco grant from the Department of Justice (DOJ) called the Tobacco Education and Enforcement Project (TEEP). This funding continues through June 2021. TEEP is a collaborative project between public health department staff, local law enforcement, and youth to improve safety and service to the community through enforcement, training, education and implementation of tobacco control policy.

Youth engagement is vital to improving tobacco law compliance in the county. Merced County youth are particularly at risk of joining the numbers of California youth that become new daily smokers each year because:

- Many experience known risk factors for increased rates of smoking, e.g., lower incomes, low educational attainment, and live in rural environments
- They live in environments where tobacco products are inexpensive
- · Tobacco products are readily available to youth
- Tobacco marketing targets youth

This project aims to protect youth in Merced County from tobacco exposure and decrease sales of tobacco to minors. First, TEEP staff will work with youth and community partners to paint a picture of the current landscape of tobacco use among youth in Merced County. Next, youth will assist TEEP staff and law enforcement in investigating illegal tobacco sales, marketing of tobacco, and retail compliance checks. Finally, youth educators will present the tobacco issues facing them to decision makers and based on findings, advocate for enforcing existing tobacco policies and/or strenthening protection for minors.
