

## **Full-Time Health Educator (Hanford)**

### **SUMMARY**

Under general direction of the Program Manager, the Health Educator supports efforts in planning, implementing, and evaluating program activities for the California Personal Responsibility and Education Program (CA PREP), a teen pregnancy prevention program in Kings County.

### **ESSENTIAL DUTIES:**

- Provides health education, coordinates activities, and delivers presentations/curriculum for the prevention of teen pregnancy.
- Provides outreach to multi-cultural groups and communities in order to promote program activities and provide education regarding teen pregnancy prevention topics.
- Represents the California Health Collaborative at health fairs, conferences, meetings, and other similar community events. Facilitates inter-agency linkages, communication, and/or collaboration at these events.
- Assists in planning and conducting teen pregnancy prevention education through the implementation of evidence-based program models.
- Co-facilitates, and at times solely facilitates, the delivery and evaluation of evidence-based program models during and after-school in a variety of settings.
- Establishes and maintains cooperative relationships with stakeholders in the community representing various sectors who support teen pregnancy prevention efforts.
- Promotes and obtains support for the program among Family PACT providers, school personnel, community partners, youth, parents/guardians, youth-service organizations, foster care agencies/providers, faith community representatives, and others.
- Under the direction of the Program Manager, assists in the planning, coordination, site logistic arrangements, and facilitation of program meetings, evidence-based program model implementation, and other similar convenings.

### **EDUCATION AND/OR EXPERIENCE**

Education and experience requirements are: a bachelor's degree in public health, social work, education or a similar field. Relevant youth development work experience of two or more years may be substituted for educational requirements and or a combination of both education and experience. A minimum of two-years of experience working with "at-risk" youth is a must.

Bilingual Spanish is preferred. A valid California Driver's License and proof of insurance is required.
